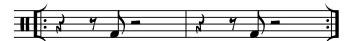


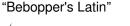

- 2) Right hand and feet only (if necessary).
- 3) Hands plus feet. Hand ostinatos 1-7 + feet ostinato 1; Hand ostinatos 1-6 + feet ostinato 2, etc.
- 4) Improvise one or all parts in the general style of the previous exercises.
